

# Membership Development

## *Alexis deTocqueville*

Who was Alexis de Tocqueville? Alexis de Tocqueville wrote a book called "Democracy in America" roughly 150 years ago. He was a French aristocrat who toured mid-19<sup>th</sup> century America.

Politicians, pundits, writers, and others have quoted him over the years because of how well he captured what made America so unique among nations, as well as some of his predictions about the fledgling republic of the time.

The reason I mention Tocqueville is two-fold. #1 – Sometimes, I'm a stuffy, academic type who likes to drop names in a futile attempt to impress people. #2 – he mentioned something about associations/organizations that has stuck with me over the years.

"Americans of all ages, all conditions, and all dispositions constantly form associations. They have not only commercial and manufacturing companies, in which all take part, but associations of a thousand other kinds, religious, moral, serious, futile, general or restricted, enormous or diminutive. The Americans make associations to give entertainments, to found seminaries, to build inns, to construct churches, to diffuse books, to send missionaries to the antipodes; in this manner they found hospitals, prisons, and schools. If it is proposed to inculcate some truth or to foster some feeling by the encouragement of a great example, they form a society."

This is where Tocqueville describes a significant and powerful aspect of American culture- our ability to form organizations and the role these organizations play in shaping our society. It is beneficial to public discourse on various issues; it is healthy for our community, state and nation; and it is important that this part of Americana continues.

Jaycees is but one example of such an organization. We are unique in that being a young persons' organization, for many people, Jaycees is the first experience in being a part of an association. For many, they take the experiences they get in Jaycees and apply them in the future, working on different ventures; commercial, government, and non-profit. The bottom line is this- *Jaycees can play an important role as a training ground for future leaders.*

That being said, as Jaycees, we have an important role to play in continuing and extending our tradition of leadership training and community development. We have a responsibility to recruit new members and get them involved. So... let us work together to do so. Please ask people you know who are of Jaycee age to join and to get involved. It can make a big difference in their lives as well as the life of our community.
