## A Message from the Community VP

We've got some great things planned for this fall in the community area. As you've all heard by now, we had to suspend Haunted House this year, which is really sad. However, the good news is that we now have time for more projects that benefit people or places in the greater Lansing area!

One opportunity we've learned of is helping out with the community garden project. They have a few different ways we could help. The first is gleaning, which involves picking excess fruits and vegetables from the garden, which is in turn donated to the Lansing Food Bank. Gleaning is more an individual project, but they do ask that anyone interested register at <http://lansingfoodbank.org/wp-content/2008GleanerRegistrationform.pdf> and then you would receive email updates. Gleaning usually takes place Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in the a.m. A group project would be checking the community gardens in October to be sure they're ready for plowing in the spring (usually involves removing stakes, string, tomato cages, and other items like any plastic that could damage the tiller or become shredded into the soil.) Thanks to Sarah Reckhow for making us aware of these projects.

Another way to volunteer is helping out with the Capital City Kid's Mile and Capital City Kid's Sprint. This is part of the Capital City River Run and promotes healthy choices for children. This will take place September 27. More information on this is available on the website, and the invitation to help has been sent out already.

We are also planning some other things that we are still in the beginning stages of. We are hoping to do a food drive, also to benefit the Lansing Food Bank. Mike Castelein is looking into the specifics of raking leaves for the elderly or those who cannot do it themselves (I keep telling everyone they're free to come rake *my* yard, but they just won't take the bait!). And, our biggest event will be the Fall Fun Fest. It will involve several different activities for children, including a trick-or-treat trail, pumpkin decorating, bag decorating, and other fun stuff we're working on. We expect this to be much like the annual Easter Egg Hunt, so we'll need all hands on deck to help out!! The event is being planned for the evening of October 30.

As always, please keep me updated with any ideas or opportunities you know of in the community area, even if you only need a couple of people. Have a great fall, and I hope to see you all at a project or two!

Tears from Mrs. Doneson, the lead teacher for these women for many years, tears from two graduates who told me they would not be graduating nor as prepared for college as they are if it weren't for the MHS program. Although bittersweet in its end, the very appreciative women were thrilled. As noted in a follow up email this week from Mrs. Doneson, "the girls are still in shock!"

The Lansing Jaycees have been actively supporting the CAHS in 2008. A painting and cleaning volunteer day was held earlier this year, and \$100 in donations was provided to CAHS through the *Shakedown* Road Rally in August. Additionally, several members have already signed up for regular volunteering with the Humane Society. The most common activity is a **TLC** (*yep... Tender Loving Care*) Volunteer. These volunteers pet, play with, brush, socialize, comfort and help clean up after the pets at the shelter. Sounds like great therapy for us too!

**Spending time with animals isn't your thing?** How about becoming a volunteer Baker – make or purchase and donate baked goods for shelter events!

**Want to step it up a bit?** The CAHS also needs volunteers willing to foster pets, help facilitate adoptions, help care for animals at PetSmart (Okemos), Assist the spay/neuter clinic, transport pets to and from off-site events, and help at special fundraising events such as the Fur Ball, Run & Walk for Animals, and off site adoption days. You can also share your special skills with the Humane Society if you are a licensed electrician or plumber or have experience with writing, grant development, photography, building, graphic design, sewing, knitting, etc!

## **President:**

- \* Leads the BOD through establishment of a chapter management program and regular review of the chapter activities to ensure purpose and goals are consistent with the program.
- \* Controls and supervises the activities of the chapter and ensures activities comply with the National and State Organizations.
- \* Exercises firm, but friendly control over major chapter projects.
- \* Organizes & conducts Local Leadership Training for chapter officers at the beginning of the year.
- \* Motivates the BOD and General Membership and assists officers in carrying out their assignments.
- \* Establishes a good working atmosphere for the officers.
- \* Chairs the BOD and General Membership Meetings.
- \* Works to stimulate chapter growth and, where necessary, completes unfinished assignments from previous years.
- \* Prepares and forwards a plan for the next President and a report to the general membership at the end of the term.
- \* Ensures all members are registered at the national and international level and that their dues are paid.

## Comparison Shopping Politics

**I know the concept sounds a little funny. But think about it – how many pairs of jeans do you try on before buying some? Do you test drive a car before you buy it? Did you buy the first home or rent the first apartment that you walked through? Most people would tell you they do research before making major decisions. Do you think this rationale applies for whom you decide to vote in the upcoming local, state and federal elections?**

**I was a senior in high school during the 1992 elections, and had my required government class during the fall semester. My teacher held mock elections every Friday after a discussion about the week's happenings in the presidential race. I abstained for four weeks, until he finally handed me a League of Women Voters guide to the election, and told me that for extra credit, I could go through and look at each candidate's responses and pick someone for whom I would actually vote. I completed the assignment and picked a candidate. And I use their guide before each major election so that I understand the choices I am making.**

**The League of Women Voters ([www.lwvmi.org](http://www.lwvmi.org)) is not just for women – it is a non-partisan group that does not endorse any candidates. They submit questionnaires about candidate's platforms to the candidates and compile the responses (and denote if a candidate chooses not to respond) in a comprehensive election guide. Think *Consumer Reports* for elections.**

**Now, the League of Women Voters is not the only game in town – it's just the one with which I'm most familiar. If you have time to find friends on facebook or spend time on YouTube, certainly you have a few minutes to google "nonpartisan voter information," and start exploring the 1,950,000+ matches that will show up in about 0.35 seconds, depending on your connection. This fall, I challenge you not only to vote, but to be an informed voter – the power is in your hands, and it's your responsibility to make your voice heard.**
