

I've researched a few projects that our friends from across the world are working on. Perhaps reading about what other chapters are up to around the globe will spark an idea in one of you. If you find that happening, contact your nearest board member immediately and we will see about fanning that spark into a full-fledged wild fire. One thing to note, around the world Jaycee organizations are adopting the JCI (Junior Chamber International) name. So, it is not the Ontario Jaycees, it is JCI Ontario, It's not Japan Jaycees, it's JCI Japan. You get the picture. The chapters in the United States have been a little slow to join in on this as we are little stubborn. I just wanted to explain that little tidbit so you weren't wondering what JCI Cameroon has to do with the Jaycees.

#### **JCI Dominican Republic:**

Members of JCI Dominican Republic have run a back to school project where they provided back to school supplies for the children at a local school and then spent time talking to the children about the importance of a good education. The Lansing Jaycees used to run a similar type of project where we took students on a back to school shopping spree. This is a project was very popular among our members, and could make a comeback if we could find somebody dedicated to running the project.

#### **JCI Cameroon:**

In Douala, Cameroon JCI members ran a job interview workshop at a local university. The program was split into two sections. First, students went through a mock interview with a human resources expert. After the mock interview the expert would then give the student feedback and advice on how to improve their interviewing skills. The second portion was a sort of lecture from a successful HR consultant. They had over 200 students participate, and established a network for follow up emails and phone calls to monitor the success of the participants.

#### **JCI Cambodia:**

JCI Cambodia – Phnom Penh has a continuous project that they have been running since their chapter was founded called the Sharing of Smiles. They have partnered with a local orphanage where they visit with the children there. During their visits they try to encourage the children to focus on education, and they work to build close relationships with the children. They also talk to them about the importance of healthy living and hygiene. They also worked with the children to plant 20 trees at the orphanage. The overall goal is to teach the children about the importance of friendship, to instill a sense of solidarity, and to have fun. I mean, it is called the Sharing of Smiles after all.

So there's a glimpse of just a few of the things going on in JCI chapters around the world. If you would like to learn more about Junior Chamber International, or JCI projects being run around the world feel free to let me know. I'd be happy to connect you to the right resources.


### Getting Unstuck

If you are interested in attending, please contact me or RSVP to the evite, so that I can coordinate a carpool for those who plan to attend.






Sean is engaged to Kellie Schneider, and the two have set a date of July 16, 2015 for their nuptials. He works as a production planner for Dart Container Corporation.

## Past President Spotlight

### Herb Reed, 61st President

A Bay City native, Herb Reed served as president of the Lansing Jaycees during 1989-1990. He also has the distinction of being the first African-American president of our chapter. He retired from working for the U.S. government in 2002.

Herb joined the Jaycees in 1982 for community service opportunities and aged out as an Exhausted Rooster in 1995.

When asked about great memories or a story he'd like to share, Herb said:

"I was in charge of getting speakers for dinner meetings two separate years.

I remember contacting Joel Ferguson to be a speaker. Turns out he was a past Jaycee. I had one of the Jaycee members, Lou Adado do the introduction because he had interned with his company while attending Michigan State University (MSU). I also remember contacting Lash Larowe, a controversial MSU professor, to speak at a meeting. My brother-in-law had been one of this students and he remembered him. Another one was Kathy Schmaltz from I believe Channel 10. Her brother and a Jaycee, Mike Domagalski, had been roommates at Central Michigan University. The Jaycees used to meet at the Elks Club on Moores River Drive. They had an unwritten policy to exclude African-Americans from membership. They excluded one particular individual and it became news. Scott Pohl was president that year. Within a few days, he announced that we were moving our meetings elsewhere. I was prouder to be a Jaycee that year."

Herb said that his greatest takeaway/skill from being a Jaycee is: "Public speaking. I was always pretty shy and hated speaking in front of a group. I chaired a project within a couple of months of joining. I was then on the Board of Directors 1983-1985 and 1988-1991. I was either speaking in front of the Board of Directors or the entire chapter on a regular basis."

Herb added: "I really enjoyed going to conventions. I traveled to cities I had never been to. For years, I always tried to get members to attend the conventions, not just the board members. It was a great disappointment to me that we could not get more of the members to attend."

Last but not least, one of the most important member benefits Herb took away from being a Jaycee was: "I made a lot of good friends in the Jaycees. I am still friends with them after all of these years."
