Assist the Philippines through JCI Operation Hope



Dear Fellow JCI Members,

As most other JCI members worldwide, I have been saddened by the news of the catastrophic mudslides in the Philippines. On Friday, February 17, we learned that the village of Guinsaugon had disappeared under the mud, and

most of its 1,857 inhabitants were missing and feared dead.

Reports indicate that only a few jumbles of corrugated steel sheeting show that Guinsaugon ever existed. The search was focusing on an elementary school amid unconfirmed reports that relatives of the 250 children and teachers had received mobile phone text messages from survivors.

On behalf of JCI members worldwide, I would like to express our sincerest condolences to JCI members in the Philippines over the loss of life in Guinsaugon. We pray that the measures that are being taken save as many lives as possible and prevent further damages on the southern part of Leyte Island and the surrounding areas.

I would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate JCI Philippines in general and the nine JCI local organizations in Cebu in particular for their outstanding efforts to provide assistance. As reported by Sun.Star, at least 320,000 pesos were raised in 10 hours on Sunday, February 19, during a radiothon hosted by a broadcasting company, the Cebu City Government, and JCI Cebu-Mactan Channel.

Additionally, seven JCI local organizations in Cebu manned a drop-off center for donations on Sunday. JCI local organizations in Cebu are giving us all an

outstanding example of how to provide leadership training while serving the community.

As decided during the January Board Meeting, JCI Operation Hope can be used to help local JCI members carry out projects to assist areas affected by natural disasters, such as the mudslides in Guinsaugon. JCI members may donate funds and ask that they be earmarked to assist, through local JCI members, the area affected by the mudslides.

In response to this is dreadful tragedy, JCI members in the Philippines are providing — and no doubt will continue to provide — needed assistance. With encouragement and support from JCI members in other areas of the world, they may become even more effective. I urge JCI members to become involved.


